City Communications City of Dayton to Launch Redesigned Website

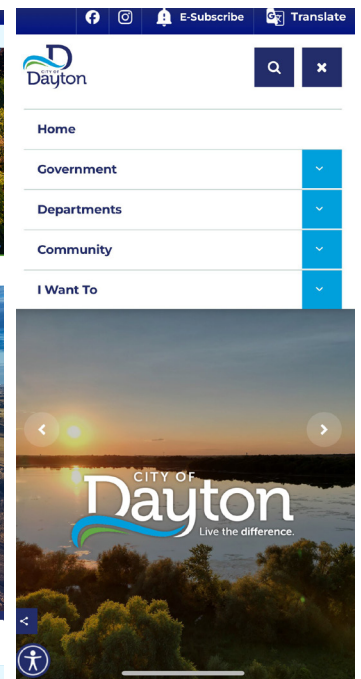

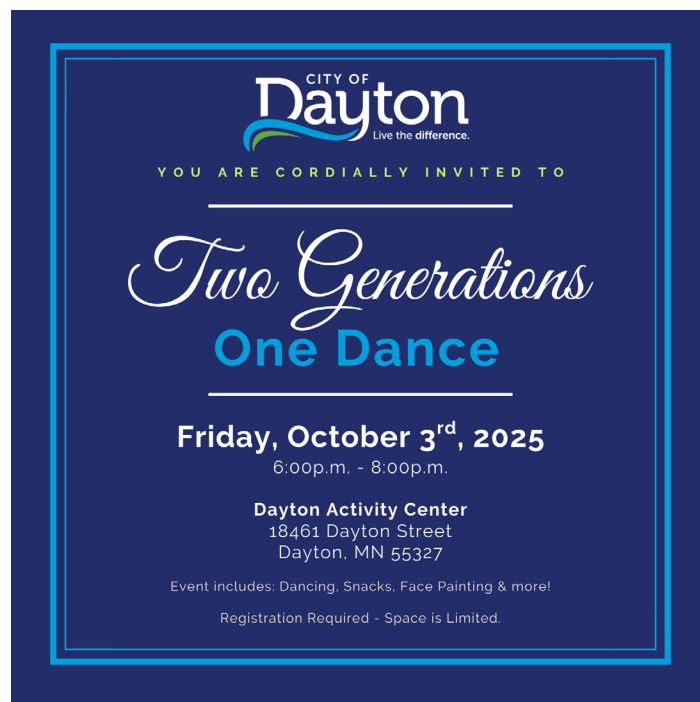

Fall Hydrant Flushing



To ensure high water quality and system reliability, the City of Dayton conducts hydrant flushing each spring and fall.

This routine maintenance helps maintain water clarity and pressure while also allowing staff to inspect hydrants for proper operation and identify any necessary repairs.

During flushing, residents may experience temporary low water pressure or discolored and cloudy water. While the discoloration may affect laundry, the water remains safe to drink and use. To clear discolored water, we recommend running cold water from a laundry tub or utility faucet until it runs clear. To find out when flushing will occur in your neighborhood, please watch for posted signs in your area.

Planning & Zoning

Development: Commercial Update

In 2022, the City approved development of the one million square foot Cubes building on Dayton Parkway. The Cubes is the largest speculative warehouse/distribution building in Minnesota. In January 2025, States Manufacturing, based in Champlin, leased 500,000 square feet. States is a manufacturer and metal fabricator of electrical shelter equipment. States estimates it will create 340 jobs at full operation in Dayton. In 2024, the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development awarded States \$840,000 from its Job Creation Fund, and \$1,960,000 from its Minnesota Investment Fund. States plans to invest \$24 million into its Dayton facility.



In August 2025, MAS HVAC, based in Maple Grove, Manufacturing announced it has leased the remaining 500,000 square feet of the Cubes. MAS's subsidiary; Daedex will manufacture heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems. Daedex expects to create 250-350 new jobs at full build-out. States Manufacturing and MAS HVAC are partially owned by Neos Partners, a private equity firm specializing in the energy industries. Though originally intended for warehousing, The Cubes' shift to high-job manufacturing is a major win for Dayton!

Residential Development Update

Brayburn Trails East 3rd Addition

The final phase of Brayburn Trails East was approved by the City Council on July 8, consisting of 36 single-family lots. Grading of the site is complete, and street and utility work has commenced in preparing for home construction this fall.

DCM Farms Development

On April 22, the City Council approved the preliminary plat for DCM Farms, a residential subdivision consisting of 253 single-family detached lots and park area north of 113th Ave N, South of 117th Ave N, and west of Fernbrook Lane N. (CO Rd 121). The project will provide a range of lots from 45 feet to 90 feet in width. Grading of the site has begun, and it is anticipated that home construction on the west side of the site will begin this fall.

Riverwalk 4th Addition

On the March 11th meeting, the City Council approved the Final Plat of Riverwalk 4th Addition, which includes a total of 74 single-family lots within the Riverwalk subdivision. Riverwalk is located south of Dayton River Road and west

of Elsie Stephens Park. Grading of the site is already complete, and road and utility work have begun in preparing for home construction this fall.

Territorial Grove

The City Council approved the Final Plat of Territorial Grove at the April 22nd meeting. Territorial Grove is a 42-lot single-family residential subdivision near the corner of East French Lake Road and Territorial Road. An extension of the Territorial Trail residential subdivision, grading and construction have begun and will continue into the Spring of 2026.

Kwik Trip

Construction is nearly finished of Kwik Trip's newest location in Dayton at the corner of Dayton Parkway and Holly Lane. This location will be large enough to serve truck traffic in the region, including dedicated truck parking. Kwik Trip will open on October 2nd at 5 a.m.

system, which is now operational. Minor turf restoration is currently being completed by City staff to improve grass quality.

Hayden Hills Park

A new well has been installed and the irrigation system is fully operational. Overseeding has been completed by City staff to enhance turf coverage.



River Hills Park

A new well has been drilled and is currently operational.

Ione Gardens/Cypress Cove Neighborhood Park

This park utilizes Municipal Water for irrigation and the system is now operational. City staff are grading the site in preparation for hydro seeding. A small landscape area has been completed, along with new tree plantings to improve the overall park environment.

Sundance Woods Park

The existing irrigation system has been extended to cover the eastern portion of the park. City staff will grade and seed the area to enhance turf conditions and usability.

Brayburn Trails, Sundance & DCM Farms

Construction on this new multi-use park has continued through the summer, with some delays due to weather. Anticipated completion is scheduled for early fall.

Completed or in-progress features include concrete poured for pickleball and basketball courts; awaiting sport surfacing installation. Sand volleyball court container is complete and filled with sand. Playground container is poured; playground delivery equipment is pending. The contractor is completing grading and getting the asphalt ready for trails and parking lot scheduled for September 23rd. Landscaping, irrigation, tree planting, and seeding will continue over the coming weeks to finalize the park's development.

These efforts reflect the City's ongoing commitment to maintaining and enhancing public spaces for all residents to enjoy. Thank you for your continued patience as these improvements are completed.

The City continues to invest in park development and enhancements across the community. Several parks have received irrigation upgrades, landscaping improvements and site enhancements to improve overall park usability and aesthetics. Below is a summary of the work completed or currently underway:

Elsie Stephens Park

Existing well has been refurbished to supply water for a new irrigation

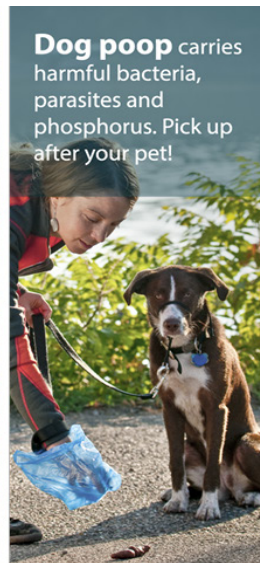

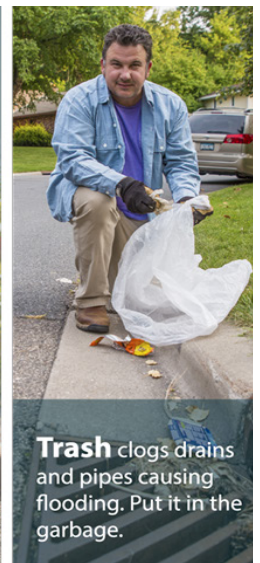
